NW Perioperative Internship Program

Fall: Sept 19, 2011-January 20, 2012

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Northwest Perioperative Consortium (NWPC) is a semi-annual, full time, 18 week course providing registered nurses entry level knowledge and skills in perioperative nursing practice. Class room instruction includes theory and skills lab. Both roles of circulating and scrubbing are taught. Each member facility of the NWPC provides the nursing intern with clinical supervision under the direct supervision of a qualified preceptor during the program.

CURRICULUM

The didactic portion of the program focuses on the theory and clinical skills of perioperative nursing practice as set forth by the Association of Perioperative Registered Nurses (AORN) in the *Perioperative Standards and Recommended Practices*.

Examples of the various patient care content are: *Safety* (e.g., infection control, sterilization, aseptic technique); *Physiological responses* (e.g., patient assessment, plan of care, interventions, outcomes); and *Behavioral responses* as they relate to providing ethical and humane care to perioperative patients and their families.

The clinical portion of the program provides the intern with the opportunity to apply their new knowledge and skills to clinical practice under the direct supervision of a preceptor. Each facility of employment/clinical site may fashion the clinical experience differently while providing a firm foundation in the development of the core competencies of perioperative nursing as defined by AORN. Interns will be provided with general clinical experience. In addition, they may be provided with experience in one or more surgical specialties (e.g., gynecological, neurological, orthopedic, cardiothoracic, vascular, otolaryngological).

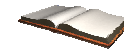
